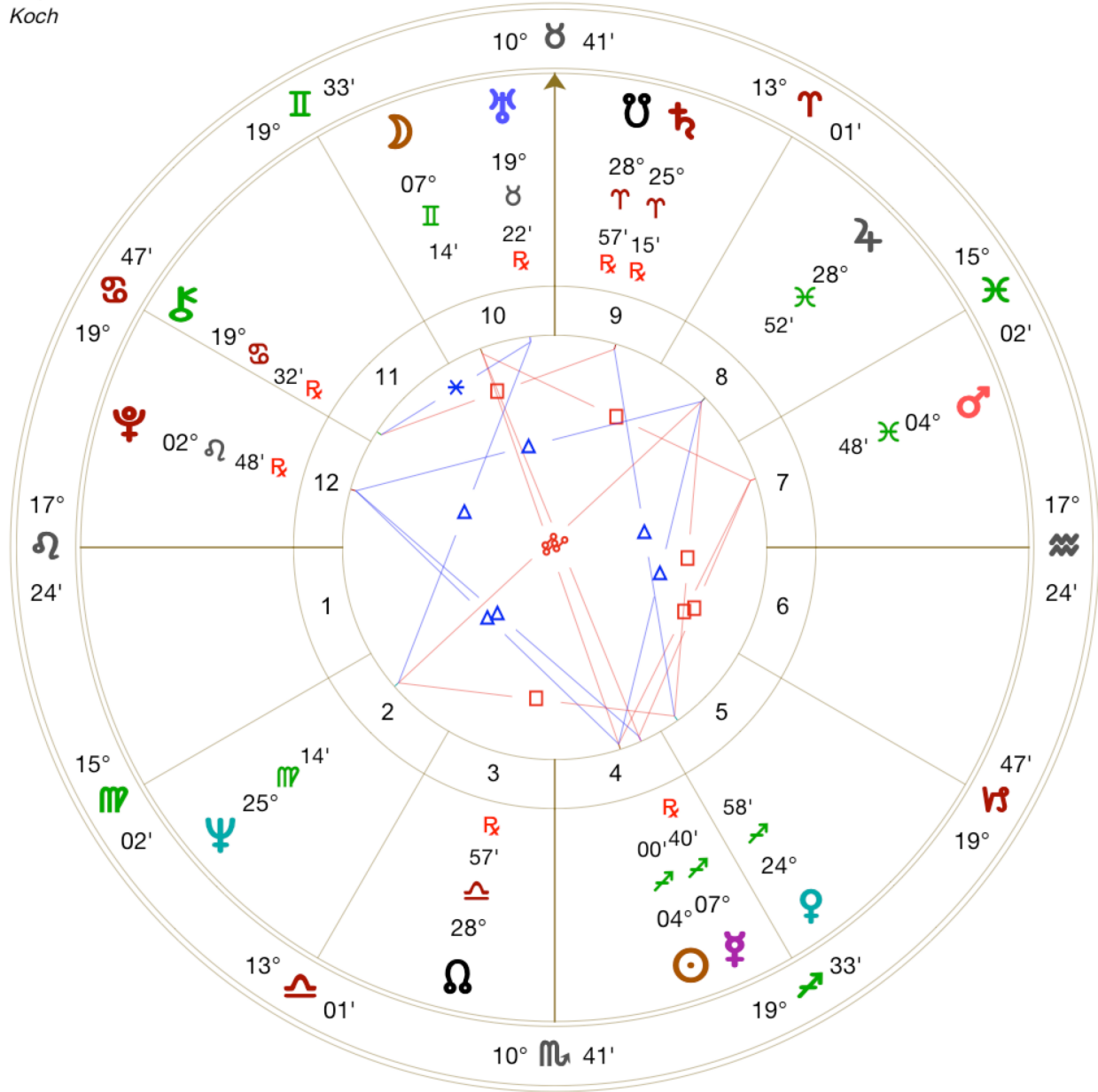

Events occur in our parents' lives before we are born. These all affect our private emotional world and how we respond to the outer world. Children born into the same family can experience the family dynamics in different ways, being sensitive to varying factors. For instance, one child may appreciate a fiery parent, while another might cower in fear. One child may appreciate, even flourish in, time alone, while another might crave togetherness. Children are also born into families at different points in time, and thus have contrary experiences. For instance, the first child may be born when the parents are just starting out, learning how to take care of a little one and perhaps struggling financially. By the time that another child is born parents are more settled emotionally and financially. The family has the same parents, but the children have different stories.

The Moon

The Moon is the seat of our emotions. It indicates our experiences in the womb and our first feelings as we enter this world. As such it tells us much about our families of origin and what we then seek in order to feel comfortable in our private lives as adults. Part of our emotional journey is to learn to recognise our subconscious urges and express them in a positive manner. Our families are our first and most intimate learning ground. Understanding the Moon in our Birth Charts helps us understand our inner urges, our feelings, our instinctive wants and needs. We can then mature and form a family and home that is supportive of our unique needs. Our private world then supports us as we move out into our public lives, expressing ourselves, forming relationships and contributing to society through our chosen profession.

The Moon is in Gemini

When your Moon is in the lively Air Sign of Gemini then you are juggling your feelings and thoughts from a young age. As a baby and child, you are likely to be restless, unless kept busy with activities. You may feel agitated at times and not know why. Parents need to teach you how to express your emotions, and also how to direct any restless energy into positive pastimes. Too much time on the internet may not be conducive to good mental health. Teachers may comment on your constant need to talk, interact and be distracted, unless they find ways to engage your mind in a satisfying way. You are easily bored. While this is not the easiest placement of the Moon, it is one which indicates a curious nature, and a keen ability to co-ordinate hand and eye movement. As such, you can excel in activities such as sports, chess, juggling and comedy. You are a born comic, using this skill to entertain family members during times of stress. You may also become adept at helping other people understand their own emotional and mental health, as you learn about your own. As an adult, you seek an active family environment. You are happy to share your home with family and friends, and to enjoy social interaction. You are likely to be irritable and moody when bored, or if you feel hemmed in by responsibilities. Therefore, you need a home that is functional but not overly fussy or expensive. Aspects to the Moon Astrologers also look at whether or not other planets are making harmonious aspects to your Moon, or if they are inharmonious. This tells you

whether or not you are easily able to fulfil your needs, whether or not your family life is harmonious, and how you can rise to the challenges that may face you in your private world. The Moon also reveals much about your emotional nature. The first place that emotions are experienced is in your childhood home and family. Therefore, these astrological aspects also reveal much about your feelings as a child, and what you learnt growing up in your household. Understanding various emotions can help you function better as an adult.

Moon is Opposite Sun

The Sun and the Moon are inharmonious in your Birth Chart. This means that you may have experienced some discord in your early family life. Perhaps your mother and father disagreed on how children should be raised, or maybe they simply did not get along harmoniously. Your basic needs may have been met, but the atmosphere in your household meant that you often felt tense, unable to get your emotional needs met. As you mature, you may be eager to leave your family home as soon as possible, striking out on your own path. One of your life lessons is to not only leave behind any strife and upset of the past, but to also ensure that you strike the right balance in your adult life. If you decide to have a family of your own, then you need to choose a partner who supports both your personal and life goals, and to ensure that you are sympathetic when it comes to parenting techniques. If your Moon is in a Fire or Air Sign – Aries, Gemini, Leo, Libra, Sagittarius, Aquarius – then you are more likely to express your feelings. Moon is Opposite Mercury

A sibling relationship is a key family relationship. It is likely to be the most enduring relationship of our life, outlasting the lives of our parents. Siblings have an impact on our early childhood, and family home, and continue to influence our lives as adults. Modern day families come in all shapes and sizes. When it comes to blended families, the relationship with a sibling can be the one stable bond as children move from one parent's home to another. Siblings, or the lack of a sibling, shapes our history and our character, to a far greater extent than perhaps is recognised. Therefore, this Family Report includes a section outlining what our Birth Charts tell us about our needs when it comes to our brothers and sisters, and the extent to which these relationships affect our family life. Much of this also depends on what position we hold in the family. For instance, the eldest child has a different role to play than the youngest. The family situation can change, sometimes dramatically, in the years between the birth of each child. Some are considered "lucky" to be born into a relatively smooth family landscape, while others may be born into times of tension. As children, we ride the waves of these family changes, with our siblings. However, the sibling relationship is complex and intense, full of extreme displays of frustration and resentment, but also intimacy and love. Every Birth Chart has a Planet related to each of the 12 House Cusps, and each House Cusp has a meaning. The 3rd House is connected to early childhood learning, siblings, your first journeys out of the family home and to connections to neighbours. In your case, Venus is the ruler of the 3rd House of your Birth Chart, meaning that your early childhood is filled with loving relationships with your siblings. In some cases, this can mean that you are the beloved only child, however; if you have siblings then you are likely to enjoy favour with them and the rest of the family. The word "favourite" may be bandied around, particularly if you have other positive astrological influences. You are charming and can be quite persuasive when you have made up your mind about something. You are also likely to be a child who asks for equality when it comes to your siblings. You want everyone to be treated fairly, and equally. When this is not possible then you may feel out of sorts, ready to push for equilibrium. You are equally likely to argue on your sibling's behalf, as much as for your own benefit. You are likely to be a "people person" interested not only in the affairs of your siblings but also in

Rulers of the 4th House give you vital information about the family environment in which you are raised, and therefore what you are likely to incorporate into your home life as an adult. For instance, your Sun may be shining its rays on the family sector of your Birth Chart. Your Sun Sign plays an important role in your Birth Chart and therefore your life. This is how you shine in the world. And so, it is important to see which area captures the light of the Sun, and therefore where you focus on the most. For instance, is your Sun shining brightly in the career sector of your Birth Chart, or in the marital section, etc? This report is focused on home and family. So, in this section you will see your Sun Sign highlighted if it is also connected with the 4th House of your Birth Chart, which is connected with your private life. This emphasises your bond with your home and family. If your Sun is not connected, then you will see which planet is most linked to those who share your living quarters, those people and the places that you call family and home.

YOUR FAMILY'S NATURE

This section is about the Planets that reside in the sector of your Birth Chart most closely associated with your private life. Planets in the 4th House of your Birth Chart indicate that your home and family life are emphasised throughout your life. As you have already realised, it is not only the planets in the 4th House that are significant, but other planetary influences. Different people learn through varying ways, and have contrasting interests. One person may be much more career focussed than another. It doesn't mean that this person has no home, but rather than he or she learns more when out in the working world. This report focuses on the private section of your Birth Chart, home and family. If you have planets in this section then you are very much embedded in your private life, and in a family environment. If you have many planets in this sector of your Birth Chart then your family is most likely the most important motivating force in your life. The family patterns that were at play when you were young are likely to be some of the major lessons in your life.

Contrarily, it is possible to have no planets in your 4th House. This does not mean that you have no family. Rather it means that other areas of your life are highlighted. No one section of a Birth Chart is completely empty. Previous sections of this report have highlighted the role that family and your home play in your life, and you can focus on these. You may also realise that while your family is important, it is not the be all and end all. For some people being born into a family doesn't automatically make them more important than other people. Some people rail against family patterns from a young age, and therefore experience other areas of life much more profoundly.

So, if you have planets in this section of the report, you may learn much about the nature of your family, the role that you play and what does or doesn't enhance your ability to express your authentic self. However, the absence of planets in this section may also give you some clear indications of what is or is not a major influence in your life.

The Sun is in the 4th House

Family life is vital when your Sun is in the 4th House of your Birth Chart. This is where you really shine. Others might want to make their mark on the world through their career, or partnerships, or self-propelled projects. However, to you family is the key arena. As a child you are likely to be a main player in your family. What does this mean? Perhaps you were the first-born in a generation. Alternatively, you could have

been the one who was closest to the head of the family, most likely your father or someone on his side of the family. Either way, you grow in confidence, knowing that you have the support of your family. Wherever you go as an adult you enjoy making your living quarters homely. This could be through fixing things if you are handy with your hands, or perhaps through decorating if you are artistic. The nature of your focus on your home is linked to the Zodiac Sign of your Sun. On the other hand, it could be you who enjoys action in your home. If this is the case then a home gym could be beneficial. The combination of the Sun and Mars can be a positive combination if you enjoy an active and lively household. The Sun is in the 4th House ...and Sun is Trine Jupiter

Jovial Jupiter is joining with your Sun Sign to give you a boost in life. Your early childhood home is likely to be a happy one which then gives you a positive boost for adulthood. You enjoy a positive relationship with family members, particularly your father and any grandfather. Your family life is likely to be happy and lively. You may

The Sun is in the 4th House ...and Sun is Trine Pluto

Some may find you dazzling, impressed with your passion and ability to "get things done". Others may find you a bit too intense, too overpowering. As a child, you may have difficulty coping with other people's reactions, particularly those of your immediate family members. Your relationship with your father is likely to be a significant one, either powerfully positive or glaringly negative. Either way, your lesson is to learn all about "power". "Power" is defined as the *"ability to do or act; capability of doing or accomplishing something."*] However, it is also important to learn the various ways of accomplishing something.
